#### Day 1 Transfer In From Baltra Airport + Highlands

After pick up from Baltra Airport we will visit Reserva El Chato

From the Village of Santa Rosa you can hike down through the Guayabillo forest to the Tortoise Reserve, though it is easier to view them on one of the farms where they share the fields with cattle, watch out for the only "TORTOISE CROSSING" signs in the world! There are also many mosses, ferns and other epiphytes on the trees, watch out for the small and large tree Finches, from Los Gemelos the road descends in a straight line to Itabaca Channel which separates Santa Cruz from Baltra, almost immediately it turns into the transitional zone and then, in marked contrast to the south side, there is a very long dry-zone. From the Village of Santa Rosa you can hike down through the Guayabillo forest to the Tortoise Reserve, though it is easier to view them on one of the farms where they share the fields with cattle, watch out for the only "TORTOISE CROSSING" signs in the world!



#### Day 2 Ferry To Isabela Island + Las Tintoreras

After Approximately 3 Hours Ferry we will visit **Las Tintoreras** where we can do some snorkeling and watch the different species of fishes, corals and resting sea turtles. Then we'll continue with the boat along the coast watching species like: blue-footed boobies, penguins, pelicans and frigate birds. Reaching the Isle of TINTORERAS, we'll get to know the blue shark, marine iguanas and sea lions.



#### Day 3 Los Tuneles + Ferry Back to Santa Cruz Island

Los Tuneles, Canals in the lava rocks with bridges and caves. Cactus grow on the rocks and many big turtles, rays and fish can be seen swimming in the canals and pools filled with sea-water. includes snorkeling at a similar nearby site where sea-horses and sharks can be seen. Los Tuneles, Isabela-Galapagos had heard a lot about Los Tuneles, but the one thing that made me want to go there was this: "It's like snorkeling in an aquarium." It takes about an hour to get to Los Tuneles from Puerto Villamil, but what a glorious hour it is! There is an oceanic path of sorts that is primarily shallow water near the shore. So on the way, we got to see giant manta on the surface, so many sea turtles I was afraid we might run over one, and of course, those vistas on the land.



#### Day 4 Diving North Seymour Island

North Seymour: Eagle Rays, Manta Rays, Hammerheads, White-Tipped Reef Sharks, Galapagos Shark, Stingrays, Marbled Rays, Tiger Snake Eels, Moray Eels, Garden Eels, Sea Stars, Sea Turtles, Jacks, Blue and Gold Snappers, Flag Cabrilla, Creole fish, King Angelfish, Barracuda, Hieroglyphic Hawk fish, Frogfish, Yellowtail Surgeonfish, Spot fin Burrfish, Scorpionfish, Cardinalfish, Nudibranch and more. Lunch will be onboard during surface interval.



North Seymour has two dive sites: The ocean side and the channel side. On the ocean side, You dive on a rocky slope and end up in the shallower area close to the island. Jacks, manta rays, eagle rays, marble rays, stingrays and even hammerhead sharks and marlins

have been seen here. There are also lots of reef fishes like Yellowtail grunts and blue striped snappers (rayado) and salemas in schools. Since there are a lot of fish here, you can often observe birds like boobies diving into the water from above and swimming down to catch them and of course there are also sea lions here.

The channel side can be an excellent dive site. The area is not very deep (about 20m) but sometimes there is quite a lot of current. You start from the eastern corner and following the major currents, you dive relatively fast over the rock plateau. Galapagos sharks cruise around and there are fish everywhere. There is a large sandy area at 15m with a large colony of endemic garden eels.

Mosquera is a sand islet which lies north to south in a shallow area between Baltra and Seymour. There's a cleaning station at about 15 m where snappers are in abundance and hammerheads may gather. The large colony of garden eels often have a large field of cushion stars beyond. The surface interval is in a shallow sandy bottom where you may snorkel with large colonies of sea lions.

North Seymour – Mosquera is a nightmare for underwater photographers because of how great it is for everything, from tiny nudibranchs to Mantas (especially between December and April).

Add to that all the rays (spotted eagle rays, marble rays, golden eagle rays, stingrays), the "piles" of sleeping white tipped reef sharks, sea lions, sea turtles and hammerhead sharks. Several thick schools of grunts and snappers are always present.

Currents: prevalently from south. It goes from moderate to very strong. Water temp: Dec - April: 74 - 78 / May - Nov: 68 - 72 degrees Fahrenheit Thermoclines: at 45 ft and sometimes also at 75 ft. You will feel the thermoclines at these two sites and you will see them before you even feel them! It's as though a crystal clear river is visible just ahead...that's the thermocline

#### Day 5 Diving Gordon Rocks(requieres 20 immersions of Experience and 2 Stars)

This is considered to be one of the best diving sites in the central region of the Galapagos Archipelago and may form part of your liveaboard itinerary. It is in fact the remains of a crater measuring about 100 metres in diameter and is located to the north of the Plaza islands. This is another site where the conditions will remind you why the Galapagos is not a beginner diver destination. Surge and current can be strong here and it is often referred to locally as 'the washing machine'. Yet the marine life seems to love the conditions, as evidenced by the sheer number of creatures. Hammerhead sharks, often seen in impressive sized schools, normally steal the headlines here. However there is a supporting cast including eagle rays, Galapagos sharks, manta rays, turtles and an exceptional amount of fish. A nearby sea lion colony ensures that, in the right areas you may spot a few of these large but agile creatures on your dive. There is also the chance to spot the endemic fur seals which present yet more evidence that diving in the Galapagos Islands is a unique experience and Gordon's Rock is an interesting dive spot within it.
